Hello and Welcome again to the Convention Corner!

Since I last wrote this column in March a lot has been "Happening"

Your Convention Steering Committee met again on Saturday March 15th at the Double Tree Hotel, the site of the 2014 GTOAA National Convention.

Our meeting addressed many issues. I want to tell you about just a few of them, not everything we covered (the meetings last about 5 hours). By the way, you are always welcome to join us if you like.

The Steering Committee agreed to use the services of Graphic Athletics to provide the Photography for the Convention.

The GTOAA Convention Meet T Shirt was also approved by the Steering Committee with just a few comments, and requested changes if possible.

Just as an FYI. The GTOAA meet T Shirt program allows for something new this year. In past years the GTOAA was responsible for the complete design and approval of the "Official" Convention T Shirt. The GTOAA Board of Directors, for the first time, have decided to allow the "Hosting Chapter" to have input on the design and sell the shirt. We still must use, and meet certain requirements along with using the approved designer and manufacture of that shirt. Our club will be responsible for the sales of the T Shirt and our club will benefit with the profits of those sales.

The Committee also approved a list of guest speakers for the convention.

Although the list of "Guest Speakers" is not complete, the following have agreed to do a seminar at our event.

We are also in the process of completing a work schedule spread sheet. Our plans are to have the necessary Tasks / Jobs clearly defined and have the ability to place you in a spot that helps fill that need.

Very shortly I will be sending an E Mail requesting your help and support for this convention. I ask that you begin thinking about what you would like to do, how much time you can offer, and how many days you are willing to help us. 2. How long have you had the car?

I bought the car in November 1995. I am the 2nd owner. It was nice buying a car from the original owner as any questions or concerns were answered promptly and accurately and still have the protect-o-plate from him.

3. What have you done to it since you have owned it?

The car was sold new in Tucson, Az at Quebedeaux Pontiac. It spent its entire life in Tucson until 1995 when it came to Pa. It is as rust free as it was 50 years ago. That being said, it did have 217,000 miles on it when I got it. The car went through an entire nut and bolt restoration and has won several trophies at the Pontiac Nationals. I decided to pull the original drivetrain and put in something bigger and stronger. It now has a 421 block with Kauffman aluminum d-ports and 2x4 intake, richmond 5 speed and ford 9" rear with 3.00 gears. I added a factory wood wheel and changed the interior from black to white and red.

4. What is your favorite memory with the car?

It's hard to determine 1 favorite memory of the car. One for sure is being on the cover of HPP May of 2003, that was quite an honor. I remember the day I came home from work and got the mail and brought it into the house. I looked at the magazine for several minutes in shock thinking to myself, the car on the cover of this magazine is sitting in my garage!

5. How often do you drive the car?

I drive the car as much as I can, weather permitting. Last year alone I put 2,100 miles on it. Since 2000 when the restoration was completed, I have put about 11,000 miles on it. I enjoy driving it outside of the city where there is less traffic and police. You can appreciate more what 6,000 rpm's sound like echoing off the countryside! Although the farmers probably don't like it.

6. What else would you like the club to know about your car?

I like all makes of muscle cars and wish I had more time, money and a place to put some different ones. However, there is something to be said about the styling that Pontiac had 50+ years ago and not just the exterior, but the interior as well. That being said, if I could only pick one it is the one sitting in my garage.

A Trip to See an Old Friend...

It was one of those moments that you always remember and wished never happened. I was having a late dinner on Friday, March 14th, with my girlfriend Ann at our local hangout. Just as we were finishing up, a “bling” tone rang out from my phone- someone had messaged me through Facebook. I looked at it and covered my mouth in horror. One of my closest friends in the Pontiac hobby, Indiana native Mike Nixon, was diagnosed with Stage IV colon cancer and was given between two to six weeks. This was an especially bitter pill to swallow, as Mike is only 47 years old and has three sons, a 19 year-old with special needs and twin 10 year-olds.

To say that Mike Nixon is a pillar of the Pontiac hobby would be an understatement. As well as being a POCI Director since 2009, he is also the POCI Tech Advisor Coordinator and a contributor to POCI's *Smoke Signals Magazine*. Mike has emerged as one of the Pontiac world's main “Go-to-Guys” for traditional Pontiac V-8 fans and the cars that they powered. In addition to his duties serving POCI, Mike has also spent the last 17 years as a moderator on the Performance Years message board, policing that sometimes rowdy portion of the Internet.

Jumping onto Facebook Messenger, a private message discussion was already in progress with several of his friends, some of whom were local and had spoken to him. I learned that Mike was leaving the hospital the next morning, and that home hospice care was being arranged. Hearing that word, hospice, clearly put the whole thing in perspective- there was nothing more that could be done for him, besides making his remaining days as comfortable and pleasant as possible.

Knowing that Mike wanted to see his friends one more time, this Facebook group quickly set up a schedule so we could all see him without taxing him too much physically. He was very concerned about his finances- as a self-employed single proprietor, he had no income if he wasn't working and didn't want his family to be overwhelmed about money, especially funeral costs. We set up a PayPal account where donations could be quickly and easily collected and then helped spread the word on several message boards, as well as the dozens of Facebook pages that Mike frequents.

I made the drive out from Fairport, New York, a suburb of Rochester in my 1966 Tempest Custom four-door hardtop. While some may find an 1,100-mile round trip in a nearly half-century old car to be a bit on the risky side, the little Pontiac performed flawlessly. In fact, this isn't even the longest trip I have driven in my Pontiac- it has been to St. Charles, Illinois last year and will likely make a repeat performance.

I was joined by three fellow PY message board members. Brian Baker drove from Maryland to meet up with Scott Misus in Philadelphia and the pair drove together in Scott's Escalade. Meanwhile, Matt Planning, made the trip in “Ramblin' Rose,” his six-cylinder powered, Sunfire Red, '64 Tempest Custom four-door sedan. We all met at Buffalo Wings and Rings in Portland, Indiana for lunch before making it over to Mike's.

Once we got over to the Nixon farm about ten miles away, we met with Mike, his fiancé' Chris Kennedy and her daughters, as well as several of Mike's family and friends, including his best friend, Troy Emery and his wife Jennifer, as well as PY members Tom and Amy Richcreek. At 6:00 pm, we witnessed Mike and Chris' wedding, which was performed in his home by the Reverend Mike Harris. There was nary a dry eye in the house.

After a couple more hours of celebrating, we all returned to our respective hotel rooms and retired. I was on the road early Sunday morning for a speedy trip back to Fairport. The Tempest performed admirably and as I drove home, I thought a lot about Mike and his courage and strength, as well as the sense of peace and happiness that he is bringing to his remaining days- inspirational to say the least.

Mike has touched the Pontiac hobby in a big way and the Pontiac hobby is giving back to him. Paul Freese and his staff at Fast Automotive in Batesville, Indiana are restoring Mike's '65 GTO hardtop so it can be auctioned off and 100% of the proceeds will benefit his family.
