- When I buy a new car I keep it until it is totally dead so for me the extended warranty could be worth it – *Anonymous*

- Extended warranties are expensive, but with all of the electronics in cars today's cars I think it's worth it. - *Fred Mansfield*
- I just bought a new car and this time I did buy the extended warranty. It's peace of mind for 6 years and 100,000 miles. It's really a personal choice, but my family attorney once told me, "When something goes wrong, you can never have enough insurance." - *Tom Monzo, Jr.*
- Yes, if you plan on keeping the vehicle for more than the warranty years. Even if you don't purchase the warranty when you purchase the vehicle, you can purchase it before the warranty years expire. It might be a little more and you'll have a deductible, but it is worth it. I learned from experience when my 2011 Cadillac engine blew up 6 months after the warranty expired and my husband insisted I get the extended policy. I got a whole new engine installed and cost me me \$ 50.00 and I'm still driving it today. WooHoo!!! - *D's 69 GTO*




